

g) Rewards

Each Team gets a certificate of participation and excellence
The best Three Teams get a reward.
The best Team gets a challenge cup.
The best Team for the shooting stations get a separate reward.
The best Team for the obstacle courses get a separate reward.

h) Time schedule

Raiding teams with long travelling hours arrive on Friday, the remaining Teams according to invitation.

Day phase: Start of the 1st Team - Saturday, 0730h

Night phase: Start of the 1st Team - Saturday 2000h.

Award ceremony is being held on Sunday, 11.00h. – The end is scheduled for 1300h.

The succession of the teams is being allotted by the “Kalter Marsch“ command. Not later than one week after latest possible registration date, all teams will be informed about their participation and starting times.

i) BOQ / accomodations

Raiders will be housed in the barrack's gym; sleeping bag etc. is to be brought by the respective teams.

j) Raiding regulations

During the raid, only issued documents, maps etc. that are being given out by the German Army are to be used!

Any usage of cell phones, GPS or other communicational devices is prohibited and will result in disqualification.

k) Fees

Participation, dining facilities (soldier's mess) and housing are free for all foreign and reserve units.

„Kalter Marsch“

**February 09th to 10th 2019
in Bruchsal**

1. General information

The Territorial Command Baden-Württemberg invites, according to Reservists Training, to the military Raid "Kalter Marsch" dating from February 09th to 10th 2019 in the area of Bruchsal.

This raid is being split up into two parts. Phase one, the day phase, is a general testing of basics soldiery skills. This is being done in and around the barracks of Bruchsal. This phase is being followed by a recovery phase. Phase Two (RED) is being held at the beginning of darkness. This is the tactical (commando) part of the raid.

This exercise requires good physical skills, a broad GENERAL KNOWLEDGE of military matters/skills and, of course, a good motivation as a TEAM. The briefing for the raid is being held in German.

2. Participants

Soldiers and reservists of the German army and respective allied and friendly nations.

Raiding team:

Troop size: 4 soldiers

ONE EXTRA is to be registered as reserve/replacement.

10 Teams Landeskommando Baden-Württemberg (GER)

10 Teams from other Landeskommandos (GER) plus

5 foreign teams (NATO / friendly nations)

3. Implementation

a) Commander: Lieutenant Col. Andreas Bensching

b) Equipment and Uniform:

Battle GEAR and All Combat Uniform – adapted according to raiding / weather conditions and simwear.

PLUS: Per person: a packed rucksack weighing 10 KG at the beginning, during and after the raid – i.e. provisions must be packed atop of that!

Per team: at least one compass, one pair of binoculars, a torch light and camouflage paint for face / extremities.

c) Registration:

German reservists via their respective commands. Active teams and teams from abroad via their respective commands / units. The number of participating teams is being limited to 25.

Teams that cannot be accepted due to too many registrations are being informed by the German Command IN TIME.

Teams planning on arriving Fridays must register that desire on the register sheet.

Last day of registration: 15th January 2019
